Increasingly one of the best British international schools in the region, if not the world, we are proud to offer a premium product. Indeed, unique in Amman in employing a majority of expatriate, **UK-qualified** teachers, at a time when the demands on the international teacher recruitment market are unprecedentedly high, we spend your fees wisely and well.


Nonetheless, our loyalty to our parent body compels us always to offer value for money, within the context of the prevailing economic climate, and we believe we strike this balance with caution and care. Although we recognise and respect the significant financial commitment required of a family investing in a high quality, international education in 2019, we are also confident that we remain highly competitive amongst international schools in Amman, and will always strive to be so. As always, we continue to offer a generous, annual **Financial Aid** package, for eligible families experiencing adverse changes in their financial circumstances. When an application is approved, this financial aid will be given as a reduction in school fees. Last year, we were able to offer up to 50% in **scholarships** to students.

Additionally, the ICS made an executive decision to cancel all extra fees for afterschool and **Challenge Hour activities and clubs** that take place within the school day, in an effort to relieve the additional fees and costs to parents. In addition, we capped the registration fee at the second child for families with several children.
