Parent Communication

I am sure you will recognise the importance of the evenings and weekends for staff to rest, relax and look after themselves and their own families. Many thanks for your continued support in helping us all strike that crucial balance between work and life, especially when the curfew can easily blur the two.

Video and Live Streaming

This week, we have begun to trial some prerecorded and live streaming tools with various classes, and early signs are that it is working very well; indeed, further details will follow at the end of this week about how we intend to roll this out, where appropriate and necessary, to the whole school. However, this does create some potential issues for families and teachers alike. Firstly, as an award-winning school in terms of Child Protection and Safeguarding, we insist that all live streaming be one-way (in other words, the students can see the teacher, but the teacher cannot see the students), and, also, that it always be in groups (in other words, 1:1 video, Skype or phone calls between a member of staff and an individual student are not permitted). We thank you for your understanding and cooperation in this.

In addition, we are also aware that different households have different internet providers and bandwidths, and different numbers of devices. Therefore, please rest assured that, as in any physical classroom, teachers will continue to employ a variety of learning and teaching strategies, of which prerecorded or streamed video are but one, in order that #themonalisaeffect be able to stay alive for every single student, regardless of their own circumstances.
